

3. The second claim is for 550 cubic feet per second year-round for fish life and fish habitat.
4. The claimed amounts for these two purposes are not additive.
5. The claim is based on the Federal Wild and Scenic Rivers Act, Public Law 90-542 (October 2, 1968), 16 U.S.C. Sections 1271 *et. seq.* and amendments thereto; Public Law 99-590 (October 30, 1986); Public Law 100-667 (October 28, 1988); and Notice of the Office of the Secretary, Department of the Interior (September 22, 1994), published in the Federal Register of October 18, 1995 (page 52801).
6. The claimed priority date is September 22, 1994, the date the subject reach of the Klamath River was designated as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.

CONCLUSION

7. As of the date of this determination, the record lacks any documentation supporting the quantity of flow requested for recreational, boating and scenic purposes. The claimant has failed to provide evidence demonstrating the connection between the specific flows requested and the purposes of the reservation, and has failed to demonstrate that the amount requested is the minimum amount necessary to preserve those uses. The claimant has further failed to provide evidence that would permit a determination that without the amount of flow requested, the purposes of the reservation would be entirely defeated.
8. The portion of this claim for 1500 cfs for recreational, boating and scenic flows is

denied.

9. The requested fisheries flows were determined by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Oregon and the Department of Wildlife using the Instream Flow Incremental Methodology (IFIM) and the Physical Habitat Simulation System (PHABSIM) module of the IFIM model. The requested flows are for protection of the rainbow trout fishery at all life stages. The evidence in the record supports these flows as necessary for the purposes of the reservation.
10. The portion of this claim for 550 cfs for fish life and fisheries habitat flows is granted.
